Principal's Corner

Cooler Temperatures: We are seeing much cooler temperatures (especially in the morning). With that said, I would ask that you make a point to ensure that your child is leaving the house dressed appropriately for the weather. If they have a light jacket or sweatshirt, they should be wearing it to school. They can always put it in their book bag, for after school, if the temperature warms up during the day.

Bus Safety: If your child rides the bus to and/or from school, we would ask that you speak to them about the importance of sitting quietly on the bus. Our main goal is to get students to and from school safely. Please speak with your child, so we can provide safe transportation for all bus riders.

Morning Arrival Time: Please be sure that your children <u>DO NOT</u> arrive to school prior to 8:10 a.m. as there is no supervision until that time. Upon arrival they should go directly to their assigned lines.

Breakfast Program: Reminder that we do not serve breakfast on days with a 2-hour late start.

St. Mark's Weather-Related Program Changes...

In the event of bad weather, St. Mark's Community Center will follow these policies:

* If **school is cancelled**: no before and after-school program.

* If school is released early because of bad weather: no after-school program.
* If school is delayed (with the exception of our normal Friday one-hour late starts): no beforeschool programs, but afterschool programs will be held following release of school until 5:30.

NOTE: SMCC may cancel after-school programs in the event of extreme weather that develops late in the afternoon. In this case, you will receive notification by program staff that the after school program has been cancelled. Notification of cancellation will also be announced by emails, phone calls or by checking the St. Mark's Facebook page.
